

### Completed Sample Sizes for Counties in CHIS 2001

CHIS 2001 completed **55,428** adult interviews statewide, **5,801** interviews with adolescents, ages 12-17, and **12,592** interviews with parents of young children (under age 12). A total of **73,821** telephone interviews were conducted in one of six available languages. A county or group of counties make up a “sampling stratum” for which a target number of adult interviews was predetermined based on the original sample design.
